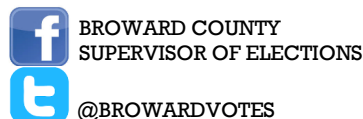

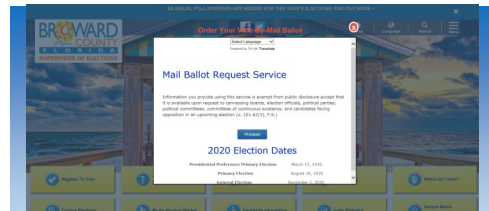

THE 2020 ELECTION CYCLE

The Primary Election is held on August 18, 2020 for purposes of party nominations for the General Election on November 3, 2020. Only voters who are registered members of the respective political party can vote for the candidate nominees in a primary election.

If all the candidates for an office have the same party affiliation (Universal Primary Race) and the winner of the primary election will not face any opposition in the General Election (i.e. no write-in candidates have qualified), all voters regardless of party affiliation may vote in the primary election for that office.

Voter Information—2020 Primary and General Elections

REGISTRATION BOOK CLOSING DATE

The deadline to register in order to vote is 29 days before an election.

Registration deadline for the upcoming elections:

Primary Election—**July 20, 2020**

General Election—**October 5, 2020**

ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF VOTER ID

When voting early or voting at a polling place, Florida law requires voters to present a picture ID with signature. Acceptable forms of ID are:

- Florida Driver's License
- Florida Identification Card issued by the Department of Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles
- United States Passport
- Debit or Credit Card
- Military Identification
- Student Identification
- Retirement Center Identification
- Neighborhood Association Identification
- Public Assistance Identification
- Veteran Health Identification Card
- License to carry a concealed weapon or firearm
- Employee Identification Card (Federal, state, county or municipality)

If the picture identification presented does not contain a signature, you will be required to show an additional form of identification that includes your signature.

VOTE-BY-MAIL GUIDELINES

- Date a voter designee can pick up a vote-by-mail ballot:
Primary Election—August 9, 2020
General Election—October 25, 2020
Pick-up of ballot on election day requires completion of emergency affidavit available on www.browardsoe.org.
- A written request signed by the voter is required. If the request is to mail a ballot to an address other than the one on file in FVRS, a mailing address is required. Exception: an absent uniformed service voter or an overseas voter.
- Voter is allowed to cure defective/missing signature on the vote-by-mail ballot certificate upon completing an affidavit and returning it as soon as possible no later than 5:00 p.m. on the **2nd day after the election**.
- It is a criminal offense for any person who provides or offers to provide, and any person who accepts a pecuniary or other benefit in exchange for physically possessing more than 2 ballots per election in addition to his or her own ballot or a ballot belonging to an immediate family member.
- You may drop off your vote-by-mail ballot at any one of Broward's 22 early voting sites during early voting period. You may also drop off your ballot at the Voting Equipment Center 24 hours a day in an official drop box or at the Main Office during business hours.

PROVISIONAL BALLOTS

A person casting a provisional ballot shall have the right to present written evidence supporting eligibility to vote to the supervisor of elections by no later than 5:00 p.m. on the second day after the election.
